- Marylyn and Ricardo met with Councilwoman VanVrancken to discuss plans for the Fat City e-Branch. This facility will include new books, newspapers, magazines and a technology room. We will also offer computer and other classes at this facility. We are waiting on the architect to finish the plans for the Avondale e-Branch.
- Our Youth Services department will have a Harry Potter Yule Fest that will feature ongoing Harry Potter activities and grab-n-go crafts for patrons to take. This event will last from November 29 January 6, 2022. Adult Programming Manager Chris Smith has also been planning programs. His December 8, event sponsored by the Pontchartrain Astronomy Society, will be held at Wagner Library. Participants will be allowed to bring telescopes to view the nighttime sky. Supposedly, there will be a space station pass-over from the southwest towards the southeast at 6:40 p.m. and it will travel sight-wise between Jupiter and the moon.
- The Friends recently had a Puzzle Sale that went well. Patricia added that the Friends will have a Table Top sale Saturday, November 20, 9:00 AM 1:00 PM in the EBR corridor. Cookbooks, Christmas books, and holiday items are some of the items that will be sold.
